1. Aladdin App:

8. School Lunches:

Our Hot School Lunches have proven a very successful venture for all at Gorey Central School. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the variety and quality of the food that is on offer.

As of today children will now bring their lunch containers home in a sealed Tupperware box whether the lunches be eaten, half eaten or only tasted. The reason for this change to the pilot is to ensure that parents are aware the amount of food their child is eating during the school day. It has proven very difficult so far to ensure that parents are informed of any children who haven't eaten during the day due to the sheer volume of children in the school. This way parents can now see first-hand the exact amount of food the children have eaten and also it eliminates any confusion between school, child and parent. Please ensure that the Tupperware container is returned to school empty each day but not the recyclable container that the lunch was served in.

9. J.E.P.:

Both 5th and 6th class are very excited about the Junior Entrepreneur Programme (JEP) again this year. The programme involves the pupils learning about entrepreneurship and creating a product or a service for a particular audience. We feel that this is a wonderful initiative and it will help the pupils develop a range of skills such as: Problem solving and decision making; creativity and innovation; leadership and initiative; putting ideas into action; being a good team player. 10. Science Week

The children in the school took part in Science Week during the week of 11-15th November. This involved a number of fun extra Science activities in all classes as well as some workshops in Gorey Library. 4th class took part in a Science Workshop entitled '*How to save the Planet in 45mins*'. This was an excellent workshop which looked at the current issue of pollution in the world: air, land and water. It was an engaging and eye opening workshop which ensured everyone went home thinking about their plastic use and recycling ways at home.

5th class also did a workshop in Gorey library on Friday, 15th November based on Rubik's cubes. The children learned how to divide the cube into layers and use algorithms i.e. methods and a set of steps to solve problems relating to the cube. The most exciting part was that everyone got one to bring home! All these activities go towards our STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) learning log and goes towards helping us achieve our STEM award for 2020.

15. Sick Pupils:

In an effort to prevent the spread of infection we ask that you do <u>not</u> send your child in to school if they are unwell (e.g. coughs, colds etc.). If your child has symptoms such as vomiting or diarrhoea, Department of Education rules require that pupils should <u>not</u> return to school until 48 hours have passed since their last episode of either vomiting or diarrhoea. Please inform the school if your child has any contagious illnesses – e.g. Chicken pox, measles, scarlet fever, etc. We appreciate your help in this matter.

16. <u>Car Park:</u> For safety reasons we ask that you insist on children using the footpaths and Junior playground for accessing and leaving the school building. <u>Children should not walk across the car park.</u>
