1ST CLASS

During November, First class participated in Science Week. Their first big investigation looked at how different activities affected their heart rate. The children read, walked, jogged and even did a minute of burpees to see what effect it would have on their heart rate. Next up was an experiment to see how far the children could make a large marble travel after being hit by a smaller marble, students adjusted many things, including the angle at which the marble was hit and the height at which it was released from. The longest investigation of the week lasted 4 days as the children saw what would happen to a gummy bear after 96 hours submerged in water.
